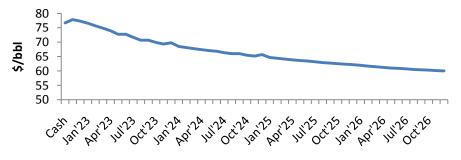

ML Sector Strategy – Looking at Oil Price Potential

- > Energy sector was the best to own in 2022 and in 2021 actually.
- > The upbeat performance of energy stocks is likely to continue in 2023.
- ➤ The counter argument to that considers the effects of economic slowdown on energy prices.
- > Yet in the inflationary environment energy stocks likely to feel pressure on costs and will rerate product prices to preserve some margins.
- ➤ Inverse relationship between dollar strength and oil price is not working well in the current inflationary environment.
- US dollar used to be a safe haven in times of higher risk.
- > But it seems that energy companies also benefit from dollar strength.
- > Price formation for most energy products is in USD.
- > Exporters rerate oil prices rerate in correlation with USD strength.
- Inventories are most likely being built as oil futures curve is in backwardation.
- ➤ While the US liquidating its oil from the reserve most likely is a mistake.
- One possible trade is to borrow at the bank credit level rates buy 12 month future and get 2 to 3 percent carry.
- ➤ 12 month WTI future trades at 69\$/bbl and the spot is at 76\$/bbl currently.
- Assuming that the spot prices in Sep 23 will be at 76 \$/bbl creates potential 10% income.
- Negative real rates always support an environment for inventories build up.
- > It will all end in tears eventually when destocking event occurs.
- > But meanwhile there is a lot of hype to ride on
